

# Art Overview 2022-2023

Children will be taking inspiration from one of 'the greats' Van Gogh. Children will be focusing on the element of line. Using a pencil to create different effects (mark making). Line and colour are basic skills, this is why they are taught in the first term. These skills will be practised throughout the year.

Children will be developing their use of basic shapes from Year 3 to now focus on proportion - Frida Kahlo.

Children will develop their skills of sculpture from Spring 1 using the natural environment. They will also apply and refine the drawing and painting skills they have learnt from earlier in the year, using line, colour and shape to draw the natural environment.

Children will be looking at artists such as Warhol and Matisse. Building on colour from Year 3- tertiary colours.

Developing sculpture skills from prior learning through the use of a different material of clay. Children will be developing their use of tools in order to create texture and effect.
